I fully endorse your comments about the "the ninth planet" news. This is yet another example of the building blocks of stars being primordial H-rich planets rather than diffuse gas clouds, as you have proposed. All the evidence of complex organic molecules in star-forming regions also point to the break-up of primordial planets replete with organic molecules that are the degradation products of life, not a stepwise build-up towards life as is constantly proposed without any supportive evidence. These primordial planets, predicted in your HGD cosmology, were collectively the site for the origin of life less than a few million years after the Big Bang. The "ninth planet" must harbour such primitive life in the form of freeze-dried bacteria and viruses.
